


Impact of COVID-19 in Rhode Island: Frontline Primary Care Provider Survey Results JANUARY 2021


January 15th – 19th (Series 25) Key Messages

- •RI providers are experiencing a shift from high to moderate strain on their practices (similar to the National averages)
- **RI providers have cut back on the number of services they offer** to patients during the pandemic. **(58% compared to 46% nationally)**
- •RI providers are willing to administer the COVID-19 vaccine, but they cannot get access to the vaccine (50%) and there is no clear plan (46%).
- •RI Providers reported that they have not been included in any state or regional planning (50% vs 39% nationally) they have no idea when or if their practice will get the vaccine. (46% vs 28% nationally; nearly double the national average).
- RI Providers are saying:
 - My practice is limiting in-person visits for respiratory related illness (88%)
 - This surge is much worse than any previous point in the pandemic (63%)
 - I have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine (63%)
 - Clinicians and staff in our practice are able to get COVID-19 testing when needed (63%)




OVER THE LAST 7 DAYS, have COVID-19 related changes and pressures in your practice put unusual strain on your practice?




STRESSORS. Over the last 4 weeks, which of these things are true for your practice?



TELEHEALTH. Over the last 4 weeks, how would you describe your use of video and phone-based care?




COVID-19 VACCINE A. Our practice is willing to administer the COVID-19 vaccine...




COVID-19 VACCINE B. Regarding the COVID-19 vaccine...
