

CTC-RI ASTHMA ESSENTIALS ECHO

(Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes)

What is ECHO?

ECHO creates a virtual learning community and encourages participants to engage in an all teach, all learn model which includes presentations from subject matter experts and presenting real, deidentified cases to specialists—and each other—for discussion and recommendations. Participants learn from one another, as knowledge is tested and refined through a local lens.

Why Asthma ECHO?

Asthma is one of the most common and costly conditions in the United States. In RI, around 1 in 12 people have asthma. Asthma can be controlled with self management education, appropriate medical care and avoiding exposure to environmental triggers. Even though asthma is controllable, an estimated 50% of children with asthma have uncontrolled asthma and 40% of adults who had asthma reported having one or more asthma attacks in the past year.

ECHO Format

- 6 online zoom sessions: 1st session 90 minutes, remaining sessions 1-hour
- Discuss and share:
 - a brief educational presentation by an expert in asthma
 - clinical case presentations from participants
- Collaboration, support and ongoing learning with subject-matter experts & health care staff

Why Participate?

- Through didactic and case presentations learn about best practices and evidence-based care for patients
- Acquire and enhance skills, competencies and best practices in asthma care
- \$250 stipend per org for attending 5/6 sessions & case presentations (for up to 25 orgs)
- Eligible to earn up to 6 CME/CEUs
