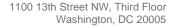

- HE PLUS 1: Collection, Acquisition and Analysis of Community and Individual
  Data The organization uses the data it collects to inform prioritization of social
  risks and social needs that may have the most impact on communities and
  individuals through interventions.
- HE PLUS 2: Cross-Sector Partnerships and Engagement The organization establishes and maintains community-based partnerships that are mutually beneficial, supportive, and appropriate for mitigating the social risks and addressing the social needs of the community and individuals they mutually serve.
- HE PLUS 3: Data Management and Interoperability The organization protects individuals' social needs data, supports interoperability when sharing data with partner organizations and communicates protections to individuals.
- HE PLUS 4: Program to Mitigate Social Risks and Address Social Needs The organization engages the communities and individuals it serves to improve the program's ability to mitigate social risks and address social needs.
- HE 5: Referrals, Outcomes, and Impact The organization and its partners help individuals with social needs obtain access to resources and interventions and evaluate the effectiveness of the referral process.
